
Life After Death: The Great Mystery

Ron Rhodes Unlocks Answers to Common Questions about the Afterlife



People love a good mystery. And perhaps the ultimate mystery is what happens to each of us after life on earth. Will I carry my memories with me into the afterlife? Will I be able to see God? Will I be an angel? Where is my deceased loved one right now? Can I be sure that I'm going to heaven?

"Over the years, I've been asked a lot of questions about what happens after you die," says Ron Rhodes, a respected Bible scholar and bestselling author. In his new book, *What Happens After Life?*, Rhodes sheds light on the mystery of life after death. "The more your present life is informed by the glorious truths of heaven, the more you will gain a perspective that will help you navigate the difficult circumstances you might face in life."

Rhodes, who serves as president of Reasoning from the Scriptures Ministries and has written more than 70 books, says that nearly everyone has questions about the afterlife because death touches all of humanity. Whether faced with the reality of our own coming death, or wondering what happened to a loved

one who has already passed, what happens after our earthly life ends is of interest to all.

"One of the big components of this mystery is that life on earth is short, but the afterlife is very, very long," says Rhodes. "For some people on earth—those who know and follow Jesus Christ—the best is yet to come."

For others, sadly, the worst is yet to come."

In What Happens After Life?, Rhodes shares key truths about the afterlife, organized into 21 short chapters that can be read over a three-week period or stretched into additional days. Written in a devotional style for the average layperson to understand, Rhodes shares what the Bible teaches about a variety of afterlife topics, including our appointed time to die, what will happen when the rapture occurs, why we'll give an account of our lives at the judgment seat of Christ, where the new earth and the New Jerusalem might be, and what it will be like to reunite with Christian loved ones. He also explains activities we'll engage in while in heaven (no, we will not fly around on clouds playing harps) and devotes a chapter to explaining what the Bible says about near-death experiences, a popular topic today in both Christian and mainstream circles.

While much of the book is focused on what the afterlife means for Christians, Rhodes also discusses what awaits unbelievers, explaining hell, the lake of the fire, judgment day, and what it means to suffer eternally.

"In view of what happens after life, what happens on earth takes on more urgency," says Rhodes. "The years we have on this tiny dot of a planet can never be recovered. And the way we use our short years on earth has profound implications for the afterlife. We must therefore use these fast-passing years with purpose and resolve."

Ron Rhodes, president of Reasoning from the Scriptures Ministries, is heard regularly on nationwide radio and is the author of more than 70 books, including *The Big Book of Bible Answers, Commonly Misunderstood Bible Verses*, and *5-Minute Apologetics for Today*. He holds ThM and ThD degrees from Dallas Theological Seminary, and when time permits he teaches there and at several other seminaries.

Rhodes served as associate editor for the Christian Research Journal and editor for the Christian Research Newsletter. He also appeared regularly on the Christian Research Institute's popular national radio broadcast, The Bible Answer Man. He holds a Th.M. and Th.D., both in systematic theology, from Dallas Theological Seminary.

Rhodes and his wife, Kerri, live in Texas and have two grown children.

- Many bestselling books have been written by people who claim to have traveled to heaven. What do we make of these types of stories and other near death experiences?
