
Discover the Story That Started It All

Ron Rhodes Deciphers the Foundational Book of Genesis

The New Year often brings to mind notable moments of the previous year and thoughts of renewal for the forthcoming year. We ponder questions that may seem fleeting but profoundly influence the direction of our lives: Why do I exist? Does my life matter? How do I know I am on the right path? "You can't make sense of our world without the book of Genesis," says Ron Rhodes, president of Reasoning from the Scriptures Ministries and the author of **40 Days Through Genesis**. "Genesis is so relevant because it helps us to answer three existential questions that we all face, based upon the reality that it is the book of beginnings." And they are:

- Who am I? Am I a chance-accident of evolution, or was I specially designed by a Creator-God?
- Why am I here? Is there a purpose to my existence, and how can I discover that purpose?
- What brings meaning to my life? Am I to find my own meaning in life, or does that come only in relating to the One who created me?



Genesis answers all these questions.

Rhodes' new release takes readers chapter-by-chapter through the first book of the Bible, providing easy-to-understand insights, summaries of key theological themes, cross-references on interesting topics, life lessons for personal application, and discussion questions. The commentary is concise and the takeaway clear.

"My book not only helps readers understand, What does the text of Genesis mean?" Rhodes says. "Rather, it helps readers understand, What does the text of Genesis mean TO ME in terms of how I live day to day as a Christian?" In Genesis, we find the origins of humankind's deepest issues and the institution of God's order. The questions that continue to preoccupy newscasters and commentators have answers in Genesis, from the same-sex debate to the ethics of the death penalty and the reason evil exists.

This unique 40-day book is engineered from beginning to end to encourage and transform the lives of readers. "I don't want this book just to touch the mind," Rhodes asserts. "I want it to touch the heart, too."

In addition to 40 Days Through Genesis, Rhodes is releasing an updated and expanded version of **The Complete Guide to Christian Denominations**. The book includes the history of various church denominations, their beliefs and teachings, and their current membership statistics—an invaluable resource for those looking for a new church or desiring to connect with other believers.

Ron Rhodes, president of Reasoning from the Scriptures Ministries, is heard regularly on nationwide radio and is the author of 40 Days Through Revelation, Commonly Misunderstood Bible Verses, and The Big Book of Bible Answers. He holds Th.M. and Th.D. degrees from Dallas Theological Seminary and teaches there and at several other seminaries.

Ron Rhodes is president of Reasoning from the Scriptures Ministries, a teaching and resource ministry that specializes in defending Christianity against atheists, agnostics, skeptics, the cults, world religions, and any group teaching false doctrine.

Rhodes has authored more than 70 books, including *The End Times in Chronological Order, 40 Days* Through Revelation, Unmasking the Antichrist, Conversations with Jehovah's Witnesses, The Big Book of Bible Answers, and What Happens After Life?, all from Harvest House.

In addition to his writing, he regularly keynotes conferences across the country and, as time permits, teaches apologetics and theology courses at Veritas Evangelical Seminary (Murrieta, CA), Dallas Theological Seminary, Talbot Seminary (La Mirada, CA), as well as other well-known seminaries. A frequent media guest, Rhodes has appeared numerous times in national media—including *The 700 Club, Point of View, In the Market with Janet Parshall*, and *Midday Connection*—and has been featured in magazines such as *Christianity Today, Decision Today, Charisma* magazine, and more.



The Book of Beginnings

The name of the book suggests the subject matter: Genesis means "beginnings." What sorts of "beginnings" are included in this first book of the Bible?
