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The Lying Tongue

Deception takes place when you intentionally try to get someone to believe something you know is not true. It occurs in numerous forms, depending upon the creativity and the desire of the deceiver. God has made it very clear that He has no tolerance for liars.

Be reminded that you yourself may occasionally embellish your résumé, the details of an incident, or your contribution to a group solution for a problem. We are often quick to see the speck in someone else's eye but ignore the log in our own.

9. Proverbs 20:7 declares, "The godly walk with integrity; blessed are their children after them." Read the story of Gehazi, Elisha's dishonest servant, in 2 Kings 5:1-27. What impact did his lying have upon his future generations?

10. Highlight Psalm 120:2 in your Bible. Write it out below in the form of a personal prayer for deliverance from a deceitful tongue.
