

Just then, J2 walked into the room.


"Did someone say my name?" he asked.

"In the pantry!" Kelsey shouted.


J2 quickly ran to the pantry and brought back a box.



"That's baking powder, not baking soda!" Kelsey yelled.


"What's the difference?" J2 asked.
